Kielder Water was the spectacular setting of the Year 6 cycling trip. The most amazing day was had by all the children who were able to cycle almost 13 miles! Year 6 demonstrated superb teamwork, cheering each other on up the challenging inclines. It was an exhilarating and action-packed day filled with determination, perseverance and lots of tasty snacks.





We are delighted to be able to report the results of this year's Bebras Computational Thinking Challenge organised by Oxford University. This takes the form of a quiz during Computing lessons and tests various computational thinking and problem-solving skills.

In the Juniors (age 10 to 12) category, Year 6 achieved a fantastic average score of 92.4 compared to a national average of 83.5. This is exceptionally pleasing when taking into account the fact that many children taking part are in Year 7. Ethan, Adam and Louise achieved qualification for the second stage of the competition by achieving some of the top scores nationally.

Our Year 4 and 5 children, in the Castors (age 8 to 10) section, scored an average of 106.7 compared to a national average score of 87.1. Ethan & Shang in Year 4 and Joseph & Lex in Year 5 achieved full marks.

In the Kits (age 6 to 8) event our Year 3 children performed very well indeed with an average of 78.3 compared to a national average of 58.6. Matilda and Poppy scored an amazing 100%.
